About the Writing

The idea for *Walk The Talk* came to me, appropriately enough, at a school where I was visiting to present the Rock & Roll Literacy Show. I saw a poster up in the hallway explaining the Walking School Bus and I asked a lot of questions and discovered that the kids had fun with it and that it really worked. It's such a good idea that I wanted to share it through Justine's story.

Teaching Ideas—Curriculum Connections

Prereading Ideas

- Justine has what she thinks is a great idea. The trouble is that she needs to convince grown-ups to go along with her idea. Has this ever happened to you? What do you think is the best way to get parents or teachers to try one of your ideas?
- Is there ever a time when you should take the blame for something someone else did wrong? And is this like lying?
- Have you ever felt like quitting and then decided not to quit? What made you want to quit and what made you decide not to quit?

Classroom Discussion Questions

- 1. Would it be possible to start a walking school bus at your school?
- 2. If a walking school bus is a good idea, who should be the ones to start it and why, students or parents?
- 3. Do you think the janitor really used toilet water to clean the mirrors or was he playing a trick on the girls who kissed the mirrors? Is it right to trick someone like this?
- 4. Remember when Justine's friends told her that she sometimes talked to much? When your friends ask you to be honest about how you feel about them, when is it okay to say something negative and how should you say it?

Suggested Activities

- Go to the website mentioned below and learn about a walking school bus.
- Plan out a walking school bus route for your neighborhood.
- Take your planned walking school bus route and walk it once with a adult supervisor and see if the walking school bus route would actually work.
