- With a friend, pretend you're a talk show host interviewing Sybil Ludington. Create a script, put on costumes, and present your interview to your class.

- The stories in this book take place in many different eras. In which of these times would you most like to have lived? Why?
- Compare two of the horses in the book. How are they different? In what ways are they the same?
- Take a look at the time line at the end of the book, then create one for your own life.
- Make a collage about one of the horses in the book.
