PLAINS CREE WORDS FOR FAMILY

In English, we use the words *my*, *your*, *his*, *her* or *their* to show how people in a family are related. In Cree, those family words have the "possessive" built right in. In the English version of this story, the Cree words are treated like proper names. When speaking Cree, those same words change their form, depending on who is speaking and how people are related.



niya kiya wiya

I, me, my you, your (singular) he/she/they, his/her/their (gender-neutral singular)

we, us, our

nôhkom kôhkom ohkoma my grandmother your grandmother his/her/their grandmother



nimosôm kimosôm omosôma my grandfather your grandfather his/her/their grandfather

your mother

nitânis kitânis otânisa my daughter your daughter his/her/their daughter

nikosis kikosis okosisa

my son your son his/her/their son
